EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

On behalf of the International Society of City and Regional Planners (ISOCARP), I am presenting information about a planning project that will be held in Clackamas County in conjunction with the Oregon chapter of the American Planning Association (OAPA) conference to be held October 24-28 in Portland.

ISOCARP, made up of 800 urban and regional planners, and architects, from 80 countries, holds annual conferences worldwide. This year's conference is in Portland, and is being held in partnership with the Oregon Chapter of the American Planning Association. The conference theme is "Smart Communities," with a focus on how technology will continue to play a pivotal role in planning and how to best incorporate technology in future planning efforts.

During each ISOCARP conference, the host city sponsors a project conducted by the ISOCARP Young Planning Professionals (YPPs). This year the YPP project will focus on three sites in Clackamas County -- North Milwaukie industrial lands, McLoughlin Boulevard in the unincorporated area and Willamette Falls Legacy. These sites were chosen by Metro, the project sponsor, to parallel efforts with their Economic Values Atlas project, which is designed to provide tools and analysis techniques to align planning and public investments in order to strengthen the regional economy.

The project will involve 21 YPPs; two coordinators, Milena Ivkovic from the Netherlands, and Michael Stott, from Canada; mentors from Metro, Milwaukie, Oregon City and Clackamas County, and approximately 70 University of Oregon Green Cities curriculum students. The intent is to test theories, assumptions and design options, and the economic feasibility of these sites to serve as a catalyst for future economic growth.


The final products will include

- draft redesign of the City of Milwaukie Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) site.
- location assessments of the McLoughlin Corridor area as the next High Capacity Transit (HCT) and transit-oriented development (TOD) sites, and
- development options for 12th and Main Street in downtown Oregon City.

The project will take place Oct. 21-24, with an orientation session, a tour and a four-day charrette. The resulting products are intended to serve as a tool for each jurisdiction to test assumptions and theories. A formal presentation will be held October 26 at the OAPA/ISOCARP conference, written material will be completed a month after the conference, and the University of Oregon students will have an entire term to complete their Green Cities projects.




