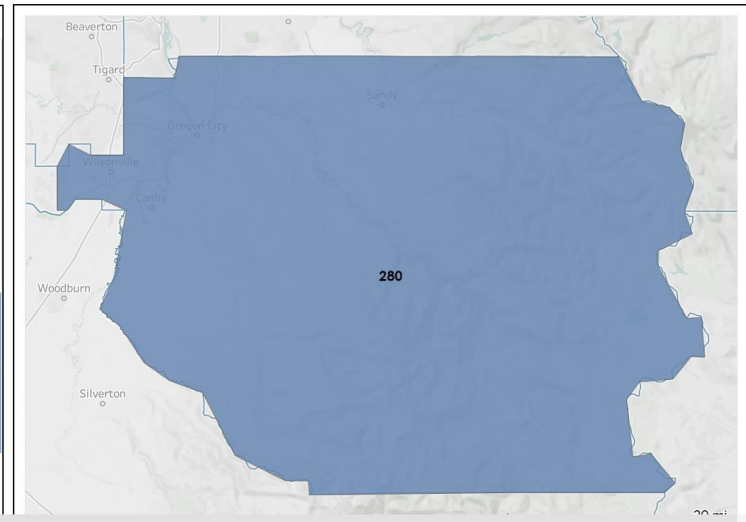
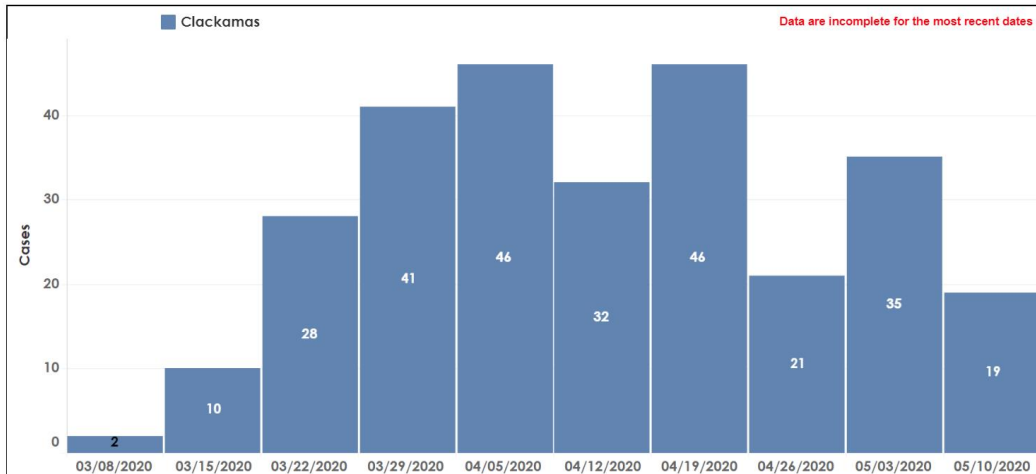

Governor's Phases for Reopening Oregon



Statewide: Baseline Reopening

Guidelines and safety measures for operating retail, take-out restaurant service, childcare, summer camps and summer school, outdoor recreation, etc.

Phase 1

First reopening stage, allowed in specific counties that qualify. Includes limited reopening of restaurants and bars, personal services, gyms, and malls. Gatherings of up to 25 people allowed for recreational, social, cultural, civic or faith events – with physical distancing requirements.

Phase 2

Second phase of reopening guidelines to be determined. No counties are currently in Phase 2.

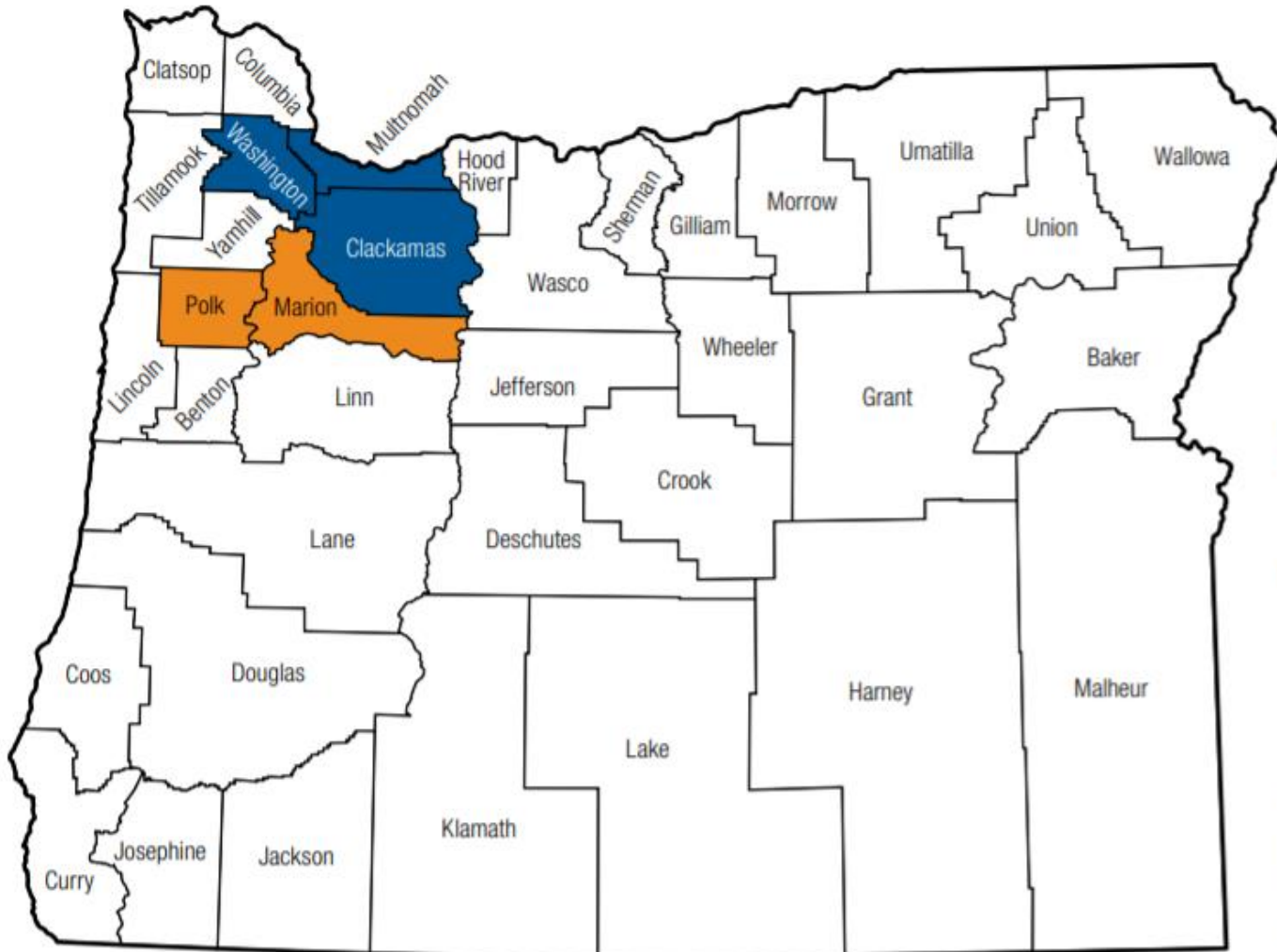


Phase 3

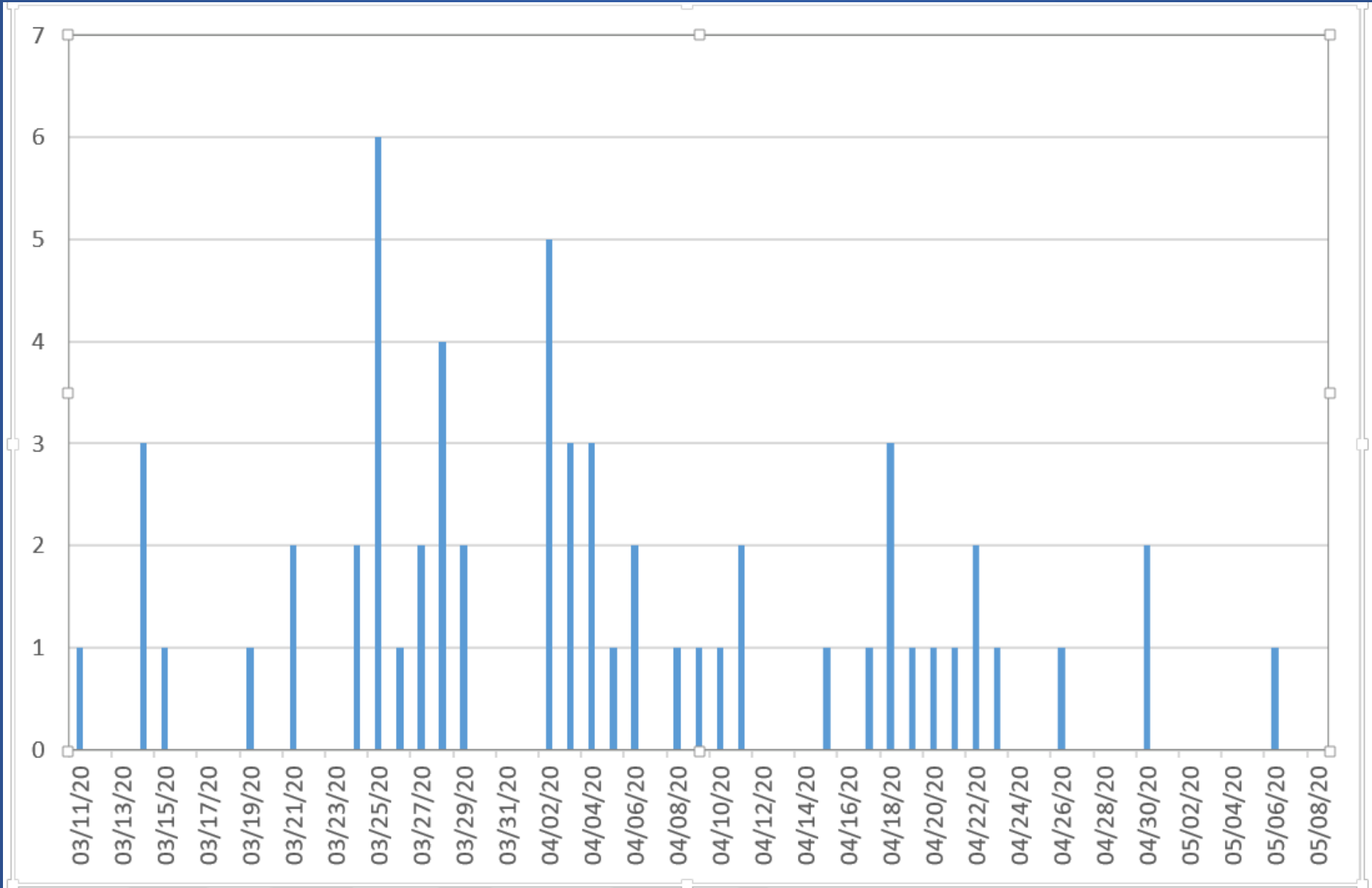

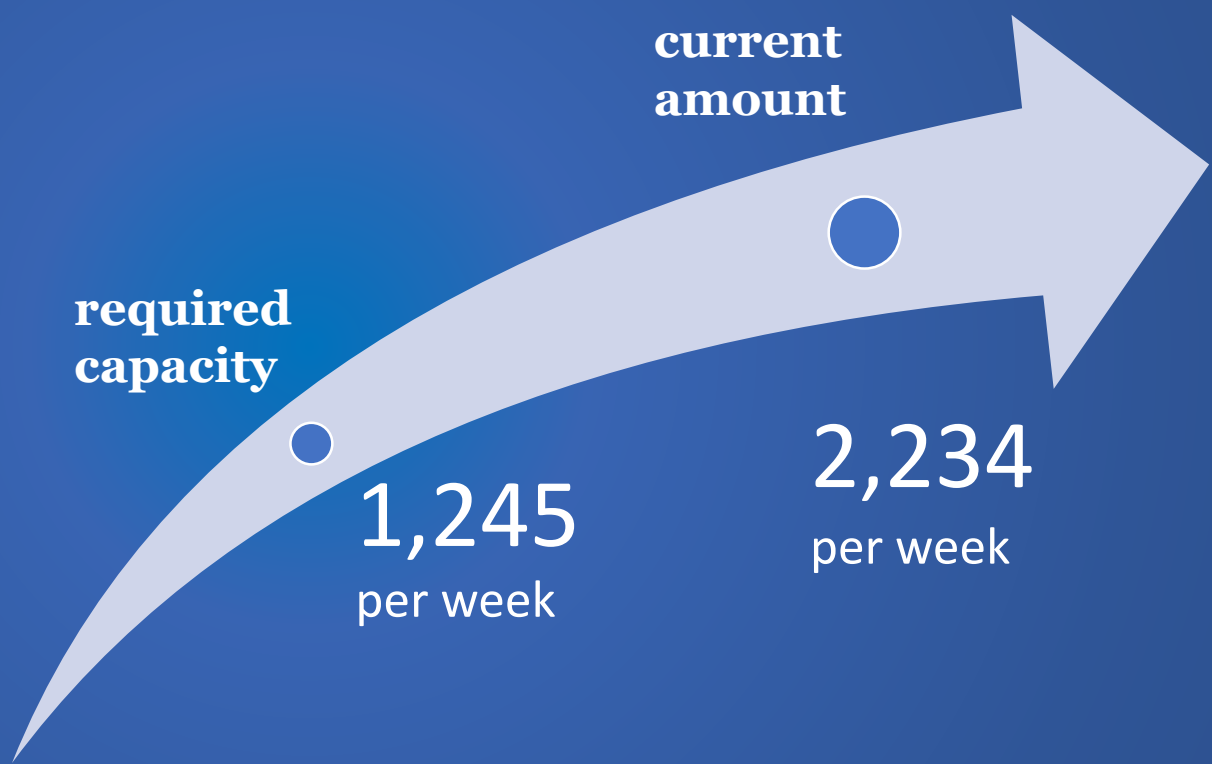
1. Declining Prevalence of COVID-19

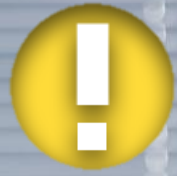

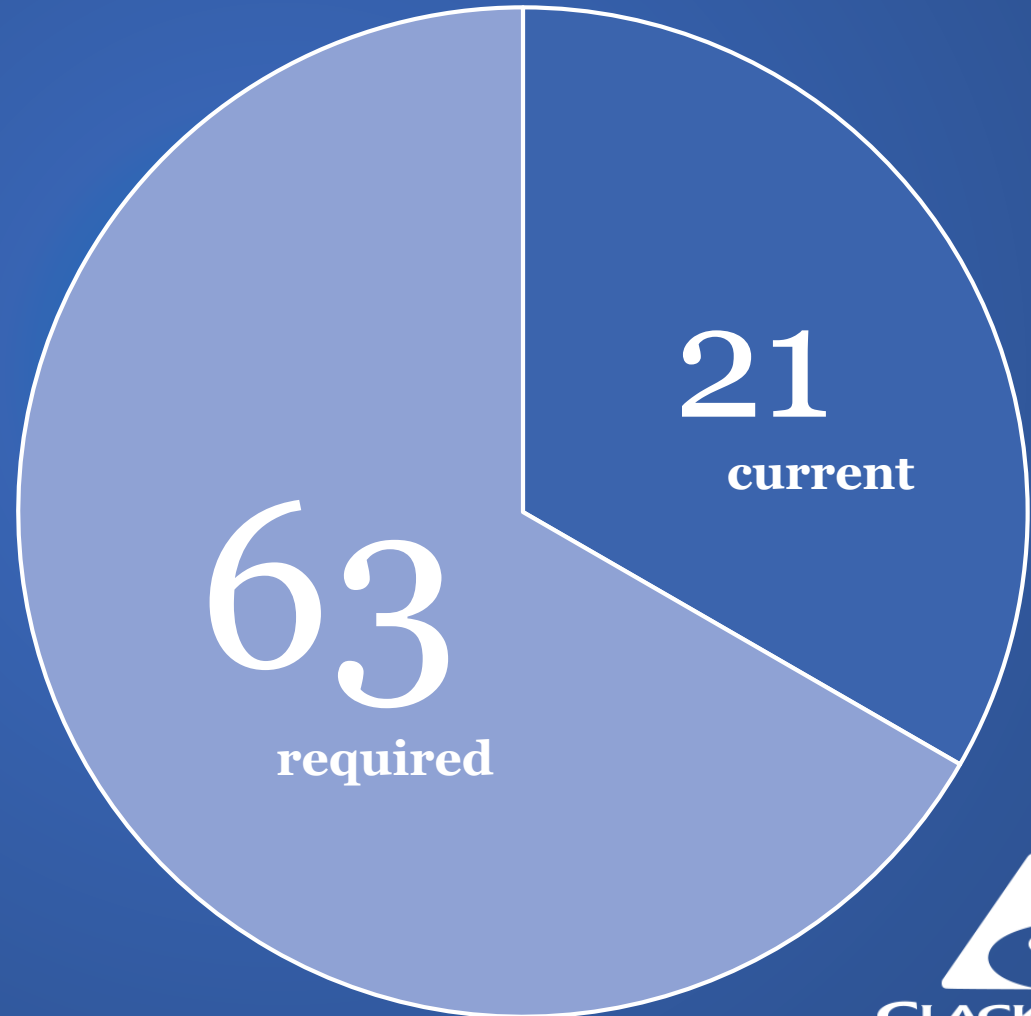


2. Minimum Testing Regimen

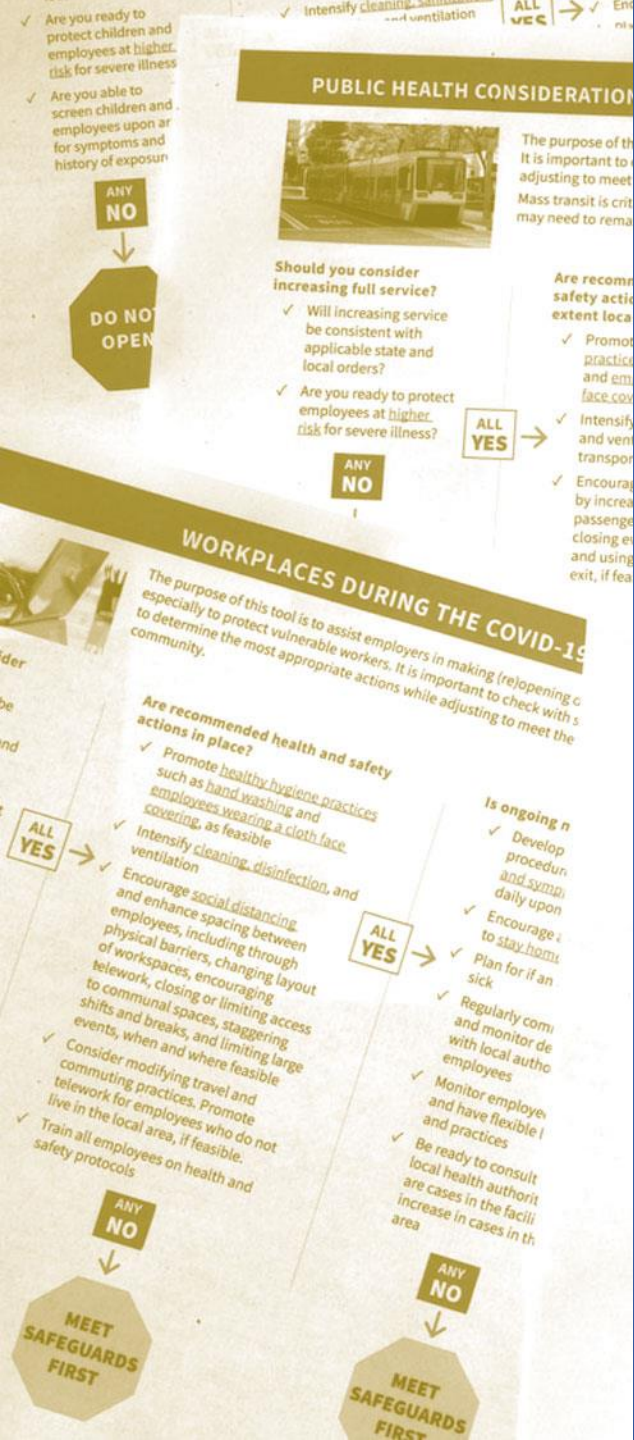




4. Isolation Facilities

6. Sufficient Health Care Capacity

The hospitals in our region must be able to have the equipment, staffing and space to provide care for a projected 20% increase in suspected or confirmed COVID-19 cases.

We have received letters from our four hospitals in Clackamas County attesting that they are ready:

- Kaiser Sunnyside Medical
- Legacy Meridian Park Hospital
- Providence Milwaukie Hospital
- Providence Willamette Falls Hospital

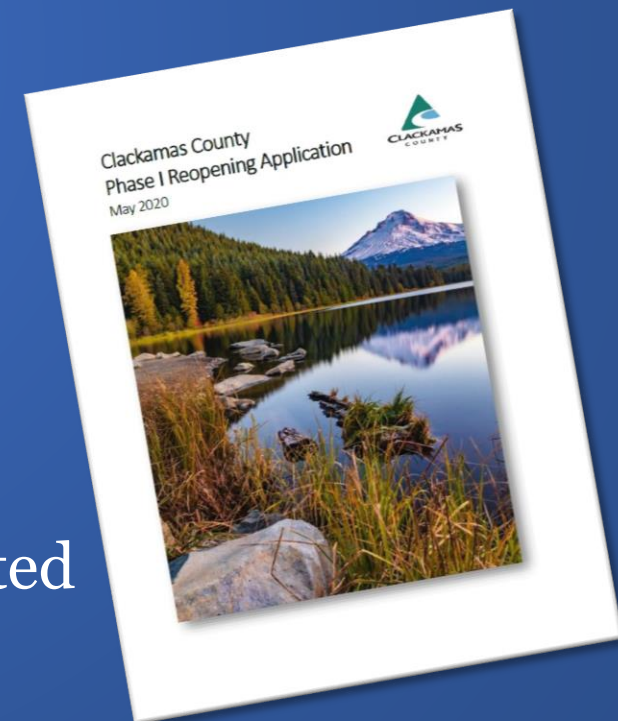

Application submission process

1. Requires a majority vote by the County Commissioners during a business meeting.
2. A letter of support signed by the Chair, the County Administrator and the Public Health Officer.
3. Once submitted, an Oregon Health Authority workgroup reviews the application and provides a recommendation to the Governor's Office.
4. Governor announces decision (anticipated within a week).



Moving forward

- Monitoring **gating criteria** for moving into next phase (phase 2 and 3), regressing, or staying in the current phase.
- Implementing a whole-community approach that supports **vulnerable populations** at highest risk.
- Development of **communication campaigns** to provide residents with the information they need to stay healthy and safe.
- Planning with partners and municipalities to **build a better future** together.
